#### Summary of PPG spending 2013-2014

#### Objectives in spending PPG:

To continue to develop Speech and Language provision by continuing to screen using Language Links; further referrals and support are then accessed through external agencies

To provide 1:1 booster with a learning support teacher

To provide support for parents and class teachers of pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium, through the provision of an enhanced, personalised curriculum

To develop speaking, listening and reasoning skills through the Thinking Together program, with the aim of enhancing skills of independence and communication for all pupils

To improve reading skills in Y5/6 boys

To investigate barriers to learning and close the learning gap for all pupils

To provide opportunities for pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium funding to access extended school provision, including residentials

#### Summary of spending and actions taken:

Speech Links program purchased and a large number of pupils already screened.

- 1:1 booster for a small group of Y6 pupils prior to SATs
- 1:1 booster for a small group of Y4 and 5 pupils in Summer term 2013 to support the transition to the next class

Reading Stars program has been purchased and will commence in Y5/6 in Autumn term 2013

Dyscalculia Screener was purchased to screen those pupils in KS2 who were demonstrating prolonged difficulties in maths

Dyslexia screener has been purchased to screen those pupils who are demonstrating prolonged difficulties in reading and writing.

Three pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium funding have had the fees paid for the Football Skills club, which is supporting their communication and social skills needs

#### Outcomes to date:

Large number of pupils screened and referred to SALT (Speech and Language Therapy) and/or specific programs provided

The four Y6 pupils who had booster all achieved level 4+ in Writing and Maths; ¾ achieved L4+ in Reading. All 4 pupils made at least 12 APS in all subjects since KS1.

The group of Y4/5 children were more prepared for their next class in September 2013 and their learning had accelerated in reading beyond 3.5 APS (average point scores progress) in one year

Reading Stars program is ready to begin this term, with pupils identified and parental support sought and agreed

Of the 12 children screened for Dyscalculia, 1 child in Y6 was found to show a pattern of results typical of a child with dyscalculia. As she was in Y6 a copy of the report was sent to the SENCo in St Gregory's to follow up. 2 other girls in Y4 were found to show results which are typical of someone with dyscalculic tendencies. These two girls will require further assessment to determine exactly where they are having difficulties and to inform teacher planning.

The dyslexia screener has only just been purchased, therefore its impact is too early to measure.
