


St Vincent's Catholic Primary School RE and Catholic Life Survey: March 2025

Please find below further information for questions which received any "unsure" responses:

The school works well with the local parish:

- Fr Raymond visits school regularly to celebrate Mass and to support children's learning in religious education.
- Staff from school work alongside parishioners to support First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion preparation, and as part of the Parish Pastoral Council.
- Father Raymond and other parishioners are elected foundation governors as part of our school's governing body.
- Children celebrate Mass in Church and lead services in Church to celebrate Christmas and Easter. They attend Parish services, for example the Christmas Hamper Service. Where Mass or liturgies are celebrated in school, parishioners are always invited.

St Vincent's supports me in my role as the first educator of my child:

- We offer a range of opportunities throughout the year to work with you in supporting your child's education:
 - o September: meet the teacher to share curriculum information for the new year
 - o Parents' evening in November and April: discuss your child's progress and targets
 - End of year report: summarise your child's progress at the end of the year and outline targets for continued improvement
 - Information shared on the school website
 - Homework
- With a particular focus on RE and Catholic life, information is shared via the school website and newsletter
 and parents and carers were invited to an information evening to introduce the new curriculum for Religious
 Education, explain changes to provision for prayer and liturgy and to review provision for Relationships, sex
 and health education.

My child enjoys learning in Religious Education:

- Monitoring of lessons for religious education clearly demonstrate that children enjoy their learning, and the new curriculum is challenging their thinking even further.
- Discussion with children confirms that they enjoy religious education lessons.

I am invited to be involved in the prayer life of St Vincent's:

- Parents and carers are invited into school to join us for weekly celebration of the word as part of Monday morning assembly.
- Parents and carers are also invited to join with us for celebrations of Mass or other liturgies at school or in Church for example, at Christmas and Easter and for monthly morning Mass on the first Wednesday of each month (when school is open).
- Parents are invited to join their child's class for a rejoice celebration linked to one of the RE topics.

Other (anonymised) comments provided by parents and carers about the Catholic life and mission, religious education or prayer at St Vincent's:

My child's favourite part of school apart from his friends is the religious side of their education and we sing hymns at home and have been known to pray on their request. I believe that this, as a cornerstone to the education that St Vincent's provides, is one of its biggest assets.

The Catholic life at St Vincent's is what makes it special. Our children have gained so much from being a part of the St Vincent's family. My child is really enjoying the new RE curriculum and is coming home wanting to talk about what they have learned.
