### Hear, Believe, Celebrate, Live

The Gospel according to St John. In this Gospel St John presents Jesus as the Messiah who reveals his kingdom through 7 signs. In the Bible, the number 7 indicates perfection. St John emphasises Jesus' divinity through his 7 "I am" statements that are reminders of the revelation of God as "I am" to Moses in the burning bush.

The 7 miracles or signs are:

- The wedding at Cana (Jn 2:1-2)
- Healing the official's son (Jn 4:46-54)
- Healing the man at Bethesda (Jn 5:1-47)
- Feeding the five thousand (Jn 6:1-4)
- Walking on water (Jn 6:15-21)
- Healing the Blind man (Jn 9:1-41)
- Raising of Lazarus (Jn 11: 1-57)



Two of the I am statements are:

"I am the bread of life (Jn 6:35)

"I am the resurrection (Jn 11:25)


The church has 7 sacraments:

- Baptism
- Reconciliation
- Eucharist
- Confirmation
- Marriage
- Holy Orders
- Anointing of the sick

The sacraments are meeting points with God that bring people into a closer relationship with God and the community of the Church

Scripture can be understood spiritually and literally




### Vocabulary


Caná	A miracle happened here when Jesus turned water into wine

Literally	Emphasising what you believe to be true even though it may be exaggerated or surprising
Sacrament	Religious ceremony imparting divine grace
Messiah	A savior
Miracles	An event that is inexplicable by natural or scientific laws but brings welcome outcomes
Divine	The quality or nature of God's being






