Key Vocabulary:

Maiden Voyage - The first journey of a ship.

Transatlantic - Crossing the Atlantic.

Passenger - A person who is traveling in an car, bus, train, airplane or ship.

Iceberg - A large floating mass of ice detached from a glacier or ice sheet and floats in the sea.

Survivor - A person who remains alive after an event in which others have died.

Bow - The front section of a ship.

Starboard - The right-hand side of a ship.

Hull - The main body of a ship.

Lifeboat - A form of transport that was attached to the boat.

Class - depending on how rich or poor you were, you would be placed on a certain level on the ship.

Carpathia - Boat best known for rescuing the survivors of the Titanic.

Unsinkable - Can not be sunk.

April 14th 1912

The lookout sees an iceberg dead ahead

April 15th 1912
12.00am



Captain Smith gives the order to call for help

April 15th 1912
2.05am



The lifeboats are lowered

April 15th 1912
8.50am



RMS Carpathia arrives in New York, USA
