## CHANGES TO PE KIT

Starting September 2025, we will be updating the PE kit requirements for all students.

We will notify parents once the items are available for purchase from Touchline and Warrington School uniform shop. We are awaiting news from them regarding availability dates.

These changes to the PE kit will be phased in. This means that if you have items of PE kit that are in line with the current PE kit policy, then your child can continue to wear them until they need replacing.

However, many items that are currently worn by children (mainly bottoms) are not in line with the current PE kit policy. From September, any children wearing branded bottoms for PE, or bottoms with pictures of cartoon characters on them, bright blue bottoms instead of navy, will be asked to wear items in line with the policy.

### Current PE kit requirements (until July 2025)

Navy blue v-neck sweat-shirt or cardigan	Required	School crest optional	Crested items are available from school supplier and second hand from the school office. Non-crested items can be bought from regular retailers.
Pale blue polo shirt	Required	School crest optional	Crested items are available from school supplier and second hand from the school office. Non-crested items can be bought from regular retailers.
Plain navy shorts, leggings or tracksuit bottoms	Required	No branding ( <i>This includes sports brands, patterns or logos</i> )	Available from regular retailers.
Trainers	Required		Available from regular retailers.

### New PE kit requirements (from September 2025)

Navy blue sport jacket/ tracksuit top. (No hood and full zip)	Required	No crest	Available from Touchline and Warrington Uniform Shop. Similar items can be purchased from regular retailers.
Navy blue School PE t-shirt with light blue detailing on sleeves	Required	School crest on the left-hand side	Only available from Touchline and Warrington Uniform Shop. Given that PE kit forms part of our 'wear-all-day' school uniform for children 40% of the school week, we deem reasonable that branded items should be worn.
Navy shadow strip shorts or <b>polyester</b> tracksuit bottoms	Required	No crest	Available from Touchline and Warrington Uniform Shop. Similar items can be purchased from regular retailers.
Trainers	Required		Available from regular retailers.

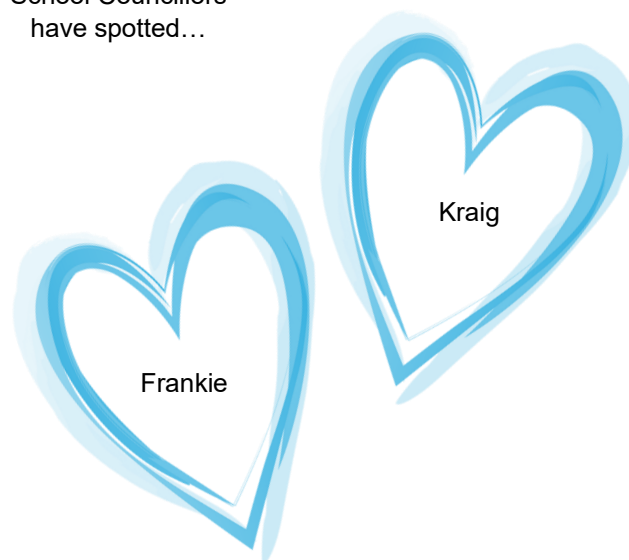
