

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CHANGES TO PE KIT—Update

As you now know, starting September 2025, we will be updating the PE kit requirements for all students. These changes to the PE kit will be phased in. This means that if you have items of PE kit that are in line with the current PE kit policy, then your child can continue to wear them until they need replacing. However, many items that are currently worn by children (mainly bottoms) are not in line with the current PE kit policy. From September, any children wearing branded bottoms for PE, or bottoms with pictures of cartoon characters on them, bright blue bottoms instead navy, will be asked to wear items in line with the policy.

We are in ongoing discussions with Touchline and Warrington School uniform shop. We are confirming the prices of the new items from each provider and are awaiting communication of when these items will be available. We will be in a position to share this information with you next week.

Given that PE kit forms part of our 'wear-all-day' school uniform for children 40% of the school week, we deem reasonable that branded items should be worn.


