Primary PE and Sport Premium is allocated to school in order to develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers and to build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Key achievements:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
uring 2024 – 2025: CPD for staff through working alongside coaches to strengthen staff confidence, quality of PE lessons and outcomes for children. Participation in a range of matches, events and competitions – feedback gathered from children after each event to ensure impact, enjoyment and inform future planning. Represented Warrington small schools at the County Athletics finals in Chester, Year 5/6 girls' football team won the a locally organised Catholic schools' league. Year 5/6 gymnasts won the Warrington RISE Primary Gymnastic Amateur Team event. Clubs run have been based on pupil voice and offer a wide range of sports: football mixed, girls' football, tag rugby, dodgeball, multi – sports, dance, gymnastics and netball Training for PE subject leader has continued, and training for staff has also taken place, with a particular focus on SEND. Sensory circuits have been developed for SEND children and embedded as part of their daily routine. SEND children have attended a Primary Inclusion day with children from other schools. AD and play leaders, supported by a designated member of staff have continued to run lunchtime widening the offer of health / sport related structured activity available PE curriculum time allocated is being maximised consistently through children not spending time changing for PE (they have continued to come into school in their PE kit when they have a PE lesson that day) Children in Year 5 and 6 engaged with the Primary Leadership in Sport program. Maintained the Gold School Games Award.	 Improve engagement of children with SEND in afterschool clubs. Continue to develop provision for physical development through sensory circuits as part of provision for children with SEND. Provide more intra-sports competitions for the children. Continued investment in staff CPD, particularly for new teachers. Continue to offer a wide range of after school clubs for the children and encourage more inactive children to attend after school clubs. Develop more physical activity within other lessons. Continue to encourage the children to live a healthy, active lifestyle. Continue to provide opportunities for girls in sport.
