


Well done Amber and her team for achieving 2nd place in the league. Amber also won the 'parents' player' award. What an achievement!

All children are expected to wear school uniform. Hair bobbles: navy / black / grey / white / blue gingham in summer

No jewellery is to be worn, except for a simple watch. We advise that earrings are not worn for health and safety reasons, however should you allow your child to wear earrings, only small studs will be acceptable, which must be removed for PE.

Hair styles must not be extreme, and should be appropriate and safe for school activities (long hair must be tied up).

Whilst book bags are preferred, a small rucksack can be brought to school. Rucksacks must be *small*, plain and appropriate for school with minimal branding or slogans.
