Genesis	Genesis is the first book of the Old Testament, describing how God created the world.
poetry	literary work in which the expression of feelings and ideas is given intensity by the use of distinctive style and rhythm; poems collectively or as a genre of literature.
Creator	Used as a name for God.
Image and likeness	Having the image and likeness of God means, in simple terms, that we were made to resemble God. The truth is that all humanity was created in the same image and likeness of God; all human beings reflect and express the image of God.
dignity	a sense of pride in oneself; self-respect.
equality	a situation in which men and women, people of different races, religions, etc. are all treated fairly and have the same opportunities:
Laudato Si'	Laudato Si' is an encyclical of Pope Francis published in May 2015. It focuses on care for the natural environment and all people, as well as broader questions of the relationship between God, humans, and the Earth. The encyclical's subtitle, "Care for Our Common Home," reinforces these key themes.
