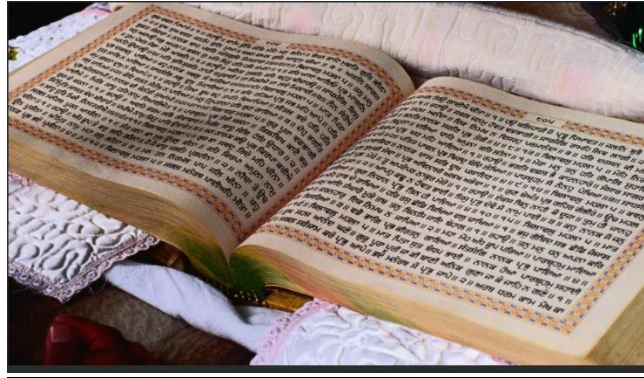


Year 3/4: Spring Term
