Thank you to Year 4 for leading our Mass today to celebrate the Feast of St Peter and Paul (29th June). The theme of our Mass is Mission, following the example of St Peter, who was the founding leader of Christianity, and St Paul who travelled the world, spreading the Word of God.

As has been shared over a number of months on the newsletter and in assemblies, our Archbishop is reflecting on this theme in calling a Synod for the Archdiocese of Liverpool and is calling on us to give feedback on how we want the Church to work better for the people that it serves - us.
