

What to expect in Year 3

Welcome to Year 3: A fun year for your child and a year where you see your child grow in independence and autonomy of their learning. The intensity of Year 2 and the focus on grammar, arithmetic, and spelling will seem like a distant memory as the new term starts. This stage marks the end of Key Stage 1 as your child enters Key Stage 2 as a Junior. In this year, I really encourage the children to become more in control of their own learning and give them many roles and responsibilities.

What will my child learn?

As in all other year groups, Year 3 follow statutory learning set down by the government.

In both maths and English, there are a wide range of expectations for the children. Maths in Year 3 has more of a times tables focus. Quick recall of the required 3, 4, 8, and 50 times-tables (as well as the 2, 5, and 10 times-tables they've already learned in Year 1 and 2). You will probably notice your child beginning to use column addition and subtraction of three-digit numbers this year, as well as learning about multiplication and division, and using — and applying — their times tables knowledge. They will also cover fractions of quantities, equivalent fractions, angles, parallel and perpendicular lines, area, perimeter, and shape.

In spellings, your child will continue to work on the spelling patterns they have begun in previous years, but this year there is less of a focus on phonics and more emphasis on understanding and learning the spelling rules, as well as attention to prefixes and suffixes. In writing we focus on a variety of quality texts and writing styles; looking at settings, language style, and character within their writing. Your child will also study different genres of writing such as poetry and play scripts.

Children are assessed at the end of the year as to whether they have met the 'expected' national standard in English and maths.

We will also continue to develop our understanding in RE through our Come and See lessons. The children will enjoy the history, geography and science topics. They will learn in a wide range of subjects such as PE, art, design and technology, computing, music, Spanish and RSHE.

How can I help my child?

The most important thing is to continue to help with homework, reading x3 weekly, spellings and times tables. By the time your child begins Year 3, they should be able to recall all the times tables and division facts for their 2s, 5s, 10s. They should already know all of the Year 1/2 statutory spellings and they will begin their $\frac{3}{4}$ statutory spellings. The lists can be found in your child's diary and these are tested weekly.

Homework is usually a selection via Teams, Ed Shed or Deepening Understanding depending on the task. It will be set on Friday to be handed in on Friday.

Your child will learn that it is their own hard work and effort that matters, not someone else's. Many of these tasks will supplement the work your child has been learning about in school.

PE Days

PE will take place on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Swimming will also begin in the summer term. We also have high expectations with regards to school uniform. Please refer to the school website for guidance.
