

Primary PE Sports Fund expenditure: Report to governors: 2015-2016



Summary of PSG spending 2015-2016

Objectives in spending PPG:

- ✚ To develop skills of teaching staff in PE to build long term sustainability of the initiative, including developing staff confidence.
- ✚ To improve the quality of the PE curriculum by use of specialist PE courses.
- ✚ To improve school participation in sports festivals and inter-school matches.
- ✚ To improve participation in other community sports initiatives.
- ✚ To provide pupils with broader experiences of PE
- ✚ To increase the number of extra-curricular sporting opportunities.
- ✚ To ensure Gifted and Talented children in PE are identified and signposted to community programmes.
- ✚ To make accurate assessments of pupils sporting ability.

Achievement:

All staff will provide evidence of achievement in PE in the form of photos, videos, statements etc. Subject Leader is able to monitor pupil progress across the school.

A new Curriculum has been in place since September 2014. The new focus success criteria for Sports is starting to be developed so that staff are aware of age related expectation.

Staff will be more aware of differing needs of all groups of pupils, including those eligible for Pupil Premium and those with disabilities. Discussions will take place and possible action around intervention if needed beyond differentiation in lessons, enabling key target groups to attend clubs and extended provision beyond the school day etc.

All pupils will be engaged and demonstrating good behaviour and attitude during lessons.

Quality of Teaching and Learning:

Subject Leader and Senior Leaders will have a clear overview of PE throughout the school, through observations of lessons and discussions with pupils.

Increased knowledge and understanding demonstrated by both staff and pupils.

Raising whole school awareness of the importance of high quality sports provision in order to develop healthy lifestyles.

Curriculum Provision:

New PE curriculum was ready for use in September 2014.

Staff consistently using and feeling confident about using the resources. Increase in pupil progress across the

range of activities. Pupils have a positive approach to competition both intra-competition and inter-schools competition.

Resourcing for and the Physical Education and Development environment is improved and enhanced across all age ranges.

Warrington Sports Academy brought into school to encourage physical fitness and enjoyment of multisport during lunchtime provision.

A greater number of pupils will take part in extended learning.

Pupils will develop leadership skills in lunchtimes/playtimes as well as during the curriculum through the development of Playtime leaders. Middles more aware of physical development opportunities at lunchtimes and able to supervise Sports activities.

Opportunities have arisen for Year 5 and Year 6 to attend a gifted and Talented Ability week throughout the half term breaks to develop leadership skills.

Higher profile of PE in school

To continue to develop assessment through the new Focus Success Criteria for age related expectation.

In Schools Sports Development

Rugby sessions

Rugby sessions have now been set up. These sessions will run as an after-school club in conjunction with sport offered in school.

Football team

A school football team has been established with the support of a qualified coach. This will enable further participation in inter-school competitions.

Netball Team

A school netball team has been set up with the support of a teacher from a local high school. This has upskilled school staff in coaching abilities and also enabled the pupils to take part in inter-school competitions.

Taekwondo Taster Sessions

Taekwondo taster sessions are offered in school and all children are encouraged to sign up for a series of sessions. All of the classes took part in a session and were highly engaged in their physical development.

Warrington Sports Academy

After school clubs are up and running now on a Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday. A new lunchtime club has now been set up during lunchtime to promote exercise and a love for sport.

Gymnastics
