

Spot the Plural or Possessive

Instructions

Place one child in charge as the 'reader'.

Ask the other children in the group to write 'plural' on one side of their personal whiteboard and 'possessive' on the other side.

The aim of the game is for the children to decide whether the noun in the sentence is plural or possessive.

For each question the 'reader' will say the noun and the sentence and the other children will then need to decide which side of their whiteboard to show.

Spot the Plural or Possessive

I can explain and use plural and possessive -s.



Noun: dog

Sentence: The dog's lead was held tightly by the owner.

Answer: possessive

Noun: boy

Sentence: After the game of rugby, the boy's jumper was all muddy.

Answer: possessive

Noun: bee

Sentence: Bees and butterflies loved the bright flowers.

Answer: plural

Noun: roundabout

Sentence: The roundabouts were spinning wildly!

Answer: plural

Noun: gardener

Sentence: The sound of the gardener's whistle could be heard over the hedge.

Answer: possessive
