




Come and See	<p>*Read the scripture provided and reflect on these key questions. Mark 11: 1-11, <i>Palm Sunday</i>. (A colt is a young donkey. Christians celebrate this special day in church and call it Palm Sunday, it is the beginning of a special time called Holy Week)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Q Where did Jesus get the donkey from? Q What did the people use to wave with? Q What did they put on the road? Q Why do you think they did that? Q Where have you heard the words 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord'? 	<p>Activity</p> <p>Make some palm branches out of paper and role play the Palm Sunday story (Mark 11:1-11)</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Create a prayerful atmosphere. Gather round the prayer focus. Think about the following words related to Easter:</p> <p>change, seasons, spring, growth, Lent, Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Alleluia, Cross, Resurrection</p>	<p>Easter prayer and reflection</p> <p>Reflect upon your Lenten promise that you made at the beginning of lent and continue this at home.</p>	<p>*Read the scripture provided and reflect on these key questions. Luke's story from <i>God's Story 2</i> page 78 <i>Good Friday</i> (taken from Luke 23:33-35)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Q How did Jesus die? Q What did Jesus say about the people who were putting him to death? Q What words and phrases do you remember? Q What does the story tell us about Jesus? Q When Jesus was dying who was he thinking about? 	<p>*Read the scripture provided and reflect on these key questions. Read the story of the Resurrection from Mark 16: 1-6</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Q Why did the women go to Jesus' tomb? Q What surprised them? Q What do Christians celebrate at Easter? <p>Easter prayer and reflection</p> <p>Read the reflection below: Reflect in your own way.</p>  <p>God of all growing bless us each day. Give us all we need to grow more like you, for you have made us and know us and love us. Amen.</p>
