

UNIFORM CONSULTATION

Thank you for the feedback on uniform, which Governors have now reviewed. Of the 90 family responses, 51.1% (46 responses) wanted no changes, 44.4% (40 responses) wanted polo shirts only, and 4.4% (4 responses) wanted shirt and tie only. Governors have therefore decided that uniform will remain as it currently is.

A number of points raised however are being taken forward:

- 1. We are liaising with our suppliers to see if there is the possibility of producing an elasticated or clip-on tie. We will update you once we have further information.
- From September, whilst book bags are preferred, children can bring a small rucksack instead if you feel that this is more suitable. Rucksacks must be small, plain and appropriate for school with minimal branding or slogans.
- To support with keeping cost of uniform down, second hand uniform is now available from the school office. Please note that school coats and shoes would also be welcome if in good condition.

PENKETH LIBRARY
