NUT FREE ZONE

A reminder to all parents that children should not bring nuts, or foods containing nuts into school as there are children in our school who have a nut allergy.



MEDICINES, CREAMS AND GELS

A reminder that children should not bring their own hand gel into school.

Any prescribed medication or cream should be administered at home wherever possible. If administering in school cannot be avoided, then the prescribed medicine / cream **MUST** be handed to the office by an adult along with a consent form.
