<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Combine words to make sentences• Use capital letters for names of people and the personal pronoun 'I'• Leave spaces between words• Begin to use capital letters and full stops	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Join words using 'and'• Use plural noun suffixes -s and -es• Sequence sentences to form short narratives (link ideas or events by pronoun)• Punctuate sentences using a capital letter and full stop• Use capital letters for names of people and places	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Write simple sentences linked to the topic• Write in the present tense• Link ideas through subject or pronoun e.g. Bats are black. They fly at night.
