Composition	 Write from memory simple dictated sentences that include words and punctuation taught. Open sentences in different ways to create effects. Organise narrative writing into clear sequences with more than a basic beginning, middle and end. Handwriting and presentation	 Use the diagonal and horizontal strokes that are needed to join letters. Understand which letters, when adjacent to one another, are best left un-joined. Increase the legibility, consistency and quality of handwriting: down strokes of letters are parallel and equidistant; lines of writing are spaced sufficiently so that the ascenders and descenders of letters do not touch.
