# Gospel Reflection for the Third Sunday of Lent Breaking Down Barriers.



"Are you hiding anything?" It's an uncomfortable question that probably invites a heated denial from most of us; yet most of us are probably hiding something. We might be trying to shrug off a nagging guilt or an unforgiving sin. We might be trying to forget an episode in our lives where we behaved unwisely. We might be trying to cover up the agony of a failed relationship or putting a brave

face on a lifetime of loneliness and rejection. How many of us are covering up weaknesses and flaws in our character? Most of us are trying to hide something, yet we would all acknowledge that burying something isn't the best way to find healing or improvement.

The woman at the well in today's gospel was struggling through life with a great deal of baggage. Firstly she was a woman with a lesser role in society, not only that, but a woman without a husband and to add insult to injury, a woman with a bad reputation. Secondly the woman was a Samaritan, a foreigner, and as such, regarded by most as a person to be avoided altogether. Jesus puzzles the woman. He is a man and he is a Jew, in other words, the very last person she

would have expected to strike up a conversation. Life had taught the woman to expect something very different. Life had taught her to expect contempt and rejection. Is this why we keep our own failings under wraps? Do we, like the Samaritan woman expect our friends family and work mates to be unforgiving and uncompromising if they knew the real us?

God's love is like a sprinkler system spreading Christ's unconditional life giving water without prejudice or judgement. Lent is the time to unravel all our hidden pain and set it before God. Lent is the time to take a leaf out of Jesus' book, to see the pain in the lives of others and break down the barriers that society has built.

# A Lesson from St Patrick 17th March

What can we learn from Saint Patrick? Well, not unlike Jesus, Patrick was a great storyteller. He had a great story to tell about his faith to the people of Ireland, and he had to figure out how to tell his story of faith to an audience that had never heard such a story before. Plus, he had to do it in such a way that people would be inclined to listen and believe.

Today we have a similar challenge, to tell people about our faith in a way that will engage and involve, that will impact attitudes and ultimately lead to meaningful change. Happy Saint Patrick's Day.

During the weekdays and Saturdays of Lent, The Bishops' Conference of England and Wales is delivering daily podcasts from the Gospel of John - "the disciple whom Jesus loved". ### CENTENARY RETREAT

Would you like to get away from your worries and cares and relax, reflect and pray for a while this summer? As part of the activities to mark our centenary, we are organising a 24-hour residential

retreat in June. This will involve an overnight stay, Friday to Saturday, with times for prayer, reflections led by Fr Mark, as well as meals and relaxation. The venue is likely to be either in North Wales or the southern Lake District, chosen for its beautiful surroundings and comfortable accommodation and facilities. The place and exact dates have yet to be chosen from those available (see display at the back of church), since they will depend on the numbers likely to come. Please note that this is not yet as a hard and fast commitment, but please only sign if you think there is a serious chance you will be taking part. Cost will be kept to a maximum of about £100, including travel, accommodation and full board, and may be significantly less, but once again this cannot be confirmed until numbers are known.
