Clara has completed Stage 3 swimming. Fantastic!



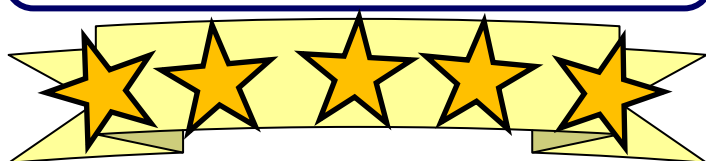
GUESS THE NAME OF THE DOG

We have a cuddly dog that needs to be named and whoever chooses the correct name will get to take our cuddly dog home with them.

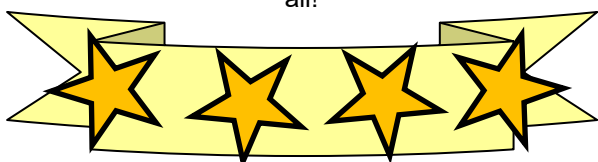
It is 50p a guess and if you would like to be in with a chance of winning our dog please bring in your money from Monday onwards.

Wonderful Water

Water is so important in order to keep you hydrated. Staying hydrated keeps your mind and body healthy and helps your brain to learn. Why not spice up your water! Around 8 glasses a day is the aim. SUN SAFETY
