Following consultation with parents in October 2017, homework policy was reviewed to take on board the wide range of responses to homework, from parents who wanted none and felt it caused unnecessary issues, to those who wanted regular and formal homework. To balance this, our policy now makes weekly homework tasks non-returnable so that they are there for those who wish to use them without the pressure caused by the need to hand it in. Curriculum homework also gives children the chance to be more creative in their response to a given question or task given all children the opportunity to access this type of homework, and also enabling them to develop their speaking, listening and presentational skills. At Year 6, homework does become more formal in readiness for children moving on to High School.

There are also posters up around school, designed by the School Council, to remind children of what to do if they feel that they are the victim of bullying. Our school was awarded the Gold Wise Up Award in February 2018 for our work in tackling bullying and hate crime, and this was retained in 2019.
