Final writing Outcome:	<p>To create a modern version of a traditional tale:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children to write their own version of Jack and the Beanstalk using Jack and The Baked Beanstalk as a model. <p>Children should focus on a change of workplace for Jack and his mum and consider the type of giant they would like to have in their version of the story.</p>
Incidental pieces of writing:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Find the key features of instructions (imperative verbs, use of and, title, use of bullet points). Follow this to build own beanstalk. Keep a diary of this. Write instructions for How to make Chocolate Cakes for Jack's Singing Cocoa Heaven shop. Sequence the events in Jim and the Beanstalk. Write a character profile of Jim and the giant.

<u>Vocabulary, grammar and punctuation</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I can use of the suffixes –er, –est in adjectives and the use of –ly in Standard English to turn adjectives into adverbs I can use of capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks to demarcate sentences I can use apostrophes to mark where letters are missing in spelling and to mark singular possession in nouns [for example, Jack's Mum]
<u>Composition</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I can write for different purposes I can plan or say out loud what I am going to write about I can plan by writing down ideas and/or key words, including new vocabulary that I will use in my writing I can proof-read to check for errors in spelling, grammar and punctuation [for example, ends of sentences punctuated correctly] I can read aloud what I have written with appropriate intonation to make the meaning clear.
<u>Transcription (Spelling)</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I can use the possessive apostrophe (singular) [for example, the girl's book] I can add suffixes to spell longer words, including –ment, –ness, –ful, –less, –ly
<u>Handwriting and presentation</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I can write capital letters and digits of the correct size, orientation and relationship to one another and to lower case letters I can use spacing between words that reflects the size of the letters
