

#### **SWIMMING**

#### MENTAL HEALTH CHAMPIONS TOP TIP



This week's top tip from out School Council Mental Health Champions:

#### Sky Stories

Go outside and look out of a window. Find a comfortable place to sit an look up at the sky. Take time to really notice what it is like. What is the colour? How does it make you feel? Are there any clouds? If there are any, can you see any shapes or pictures within them? Spend as long as you need just relaxing and noticing until you feel calm, relaxed and settled.

#### Pencil Patterns

Get a piece of paper, a pen or pencil and some colouring pencils. Find a comfortable place to sit and then use your pen or pencil and go for a walk on your piece of paper. Let it go wherever it feels like – just let it wander.

What patterns have you made? How does your pattern make you feel? Now, colour in your pattern focusing on your breathing gently as you work. How does the pen or pencil feel and what do you notice as your pattern comes to life?
