### **English**

**Spelling learning:**

High frequency words

Adding -ed, -ing, -er and -est to a root word ending in -y with a consonant before it.

Adding the endings – ing, –ed, –er, –est and –y to words ending in –e with a consonant before it.

Adding –ing, –ed, –er, –est and –y to words of one syllable ending in a single consonant letter after a single vowel letter. The /ɔ:/ sound spelt a before I and II.

**Topics:** Spread the word

**Explore:** Passing on messages.

**Reveal:** Pentecost, spreading the Gospel message through the gift of

the gift of the Holy Spirit.

**Topics:** Rules

**Reveal:** The reasons for rules in

the Christian family.

**Respond**: Remembering, celebrating and responding to how rules can help at home and in school and the reasons for rules in the Christian family.

#### Maths

<u>Consolidation</u> – All four operations.

### Geometry: position and direction

Learning outcomes:

- Pupils should be taught to: order and arrange combinations of mathematical objects in patterns and sequences
- Use mathematical vocabulary to describe position, direction and movement, including movement in a straight line and distinguishing between rotation as a turn and in terms of right angles for quarter, half and three-quarter turns (clockwise and anticlockwise)

# Measurement: Time

Learning outcomes:

- Tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.
- Know the number of minutes in an hour & the number of hours in a day.
- Compare and sequence intervals of time.

# Measurement: Mass, capacity and temperature.

Learning outcomes:

- Choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure capacity (I/mI) and temperature (oC) to the nearest appropriate unit, using thermometers and measuring vessels.
- Compare and order volume/capacity & record the results using >, < and =</li>

# **Science**

# <u>Topic:</u> Young Gardeners

Learning outcomes:

- To identify and name a variety of plants.
- To observe and describe how seeds grow into mature plants.
- To find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy.
- To identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses.

#### Music

Topic: Friendship Song Learning outcomes:

- Combining sounds to create a musical effect.
- Understanding how music, dance and drama can combine in storytelling.
- Combining sounds to create a musical effect.
- Performing to an audience.

## **Computing**

# **Topic: We are photographers**

Learning outcomes:

This unit will enable the children to consider the technical and artistic merits of photographs

- use a digital camera or camera app take digital photographs
- review and reject or pick the images they take edit
- Enhance their photographs select their best images to include in a shared portfolio.

## **History / Geography**

Topic: Where does our food come from?

- Understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human geography of their local shops, and physical geography through studying nearby food growing or production
- Use locational and directional language (e.g. near and far ) to describe the location of features and routes on a map
- Name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom, and its surrounding seas
- Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied at this key stage.

<u>Learning outcomes</u>: REAL PE unit 5 – Physical skills.

 Master basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching, as well as developing balance, agility and co-ordination, and begin to apply these in a range of activities.

Learning outcomes:

<u>Art – Nature sculptures/ observational drawings</u>

- To develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.
- About the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.
- To use a range of materials creatively to design and make products.
