

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Please note that we are now returning to pre-COVID-19 expectations and monitoring of attendance and punctuality as absence due to COVID-19 is no longer coded any differently to other illness and there is no requirement to remain absent once well enough to attend school. Information about attendance and punctuality is contained within your child's school planner and our full school policy is available on the school website.

<u>Attendance</u>

Attendance is monitored regularly, and if your child's attendance starts to cause concern, the following action will be taken in the first instance:

Parents/carers of any child whose attendance has already fallen below 90% will shortly receive a letter, and if attendance does not improve, then a meeting will be arranged to discuss support and next steps.

From the Spring Term onwards, parents/carers of any child whose attendance has fallen below 95% will receive a letter explaining that attendance is being monitored and must improve. Absence below 95% marks a significant loss of learning time for a child.

School term dates are published a year in advance so that family holidays can be planned. It is therefore not necessary to take children out of school for holidays and any holidays during term time will be unauthorised.

100%	OUTSTANDING!	
97% +	Excellent! Less than 6 days absent in a year.	
95%	10 days (2 weeks) absent in a year. Attendance level will be monitored.	
90%	19 days absent over a year (almost a month). This is classed as persistent absence and is unacceptable. Attendance must improve and action could now be taken.	
85% or below	29 days absent over a year (almost a half term). Attendance at this level most certainly will result in the involvement of the Attendance Officer.

Punctuality

School begins at 8.45am If your child arrives after the close of the register at 8.50am, they will be marked as late. Teaching punctuality is an important skill and shows respect for other people. Lateness sets the day off to a poor start for everyone, prevents learning from beginning efficiently and above all is embarrassing for the child. Lateness also impacts significantly on learning – 5 minutes late every day adds up to 3 whole days of lost learning time.

Medical appointments

Any medical appointments should, where possible, be made for out of school hours. If an appointment is within school time we should be notified prior to this appointment and children should be collected / dropped off from the school office.
