Key Artists:

Shen Zhou



Shen Zhou was a Chinese painter in the Ming dynasty (1368–1644). He was born into an honoured and wealthy family in Changzhou, which is in the south of Jiangsu province. Shen Zhou never took up any official post, but instead enjoyed a long life involved in the learned arts of poetry, painting, and calligraphy.

Investigate (style / techniques / examples):

- Select ideas based on observations of various Chinese art
- Describe the work and ideas of various Chinese artists using appropriate vocabulary and referring to historical and cultural contexts.
- Refine their use of sketching and brushstrokes, using techniques from Chinese artwork.
- Learn about the use of the 'Four Gentlemen'
 which are the four plants based on the four
 seasons: bamboo, plum blossom, orchid and
 chrysanthemum and techniques to sketch and
 paint them.

The Four Gentlemen




Design and Create:
