Focus skills	

Appropriate use of expanded noun phrases, adverbs and preposition phrases to convey complicated information concisely and to add detail including some repetition of noun phrases e.g. a glimpse of a lady's ankle; Just hear me out- all your children and all the children in town will love it!; I was obviously talking about the play; because of the curved walls.

Use appropriate choice of tense to support whole text cohesion and coherence.
