PARKING ISSUES

There have been multiple issues with parking this week at the start and end of day, and having personally witnessed some dangerous driver behaviour, and had incidents reported by staff and parents, I once again remind you of our expectation with regards to dropping off and picking up children:

PARKING BEYOND THE BARRIER IS **STRICTLY** FOR STAFF OR THOSE WITH A BLUE DISABLED BADGE ONLY.

CARS SHOULD BE PARKED AT THE RED LION / COOP CAR PARK OR OLIVE TREE COMMUNITY CENTRE CAR PARK AND THEN CHILDREN SHOULD BE WALKED UP TO SCHOOL FROM THERE.

STREET PARKING SHOULD BE AVOIDED WHEREVER POSSIBLE AND WHERE ABSOLUTELY UNAVOIDABLE, IT SHOULD BE DONE RESPONSIBLY, FOLLOWING ROAD MARKINGS AND NOT CAUSING AN OBSTRUCTION TO PEDESTRIANS, OTHER DRIVERS AND NEIGHBOURS.

Our only priority at this time should be to make sure that children are safe arriving at or leaving school. Please make sure that you leave for school in enough time to park safely and walk into school rather than putting children at risk.

Thank you in anticipation of your cooperation and consideration of the safety of others.

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
