Year 3

English

Text: Snow Dragon

Writing: Response to inference questioning. Setting description. Character description. Predictions. Question responses to text. Sequence ideas or events maintaining writing form e.g. bullet points for instructions, headings for an information text. Proof reading for spelling errors. Re-read writing to check for meaning and tense form. Begin to evaluate the effectiveness of own and others' writing, suggesting grammar and vocabulary improvements. Grammar learning: To know the term 'adverb'. To use the suffix -ly to turn adjectives into adverbs. To understand the rules for adding -lv. To express time, place and cause using adverbs. To understand that apostrophes are used to mark where letters are missing in spelling (contraction). To use apostrophes to mark singular possession in nouns. To understand the terminology 'inverted commas', 'speech marks' and 'direct speech'. To use inverted commas to punctuate direct speech. To understand how to add a prefix at the beginning of a word in order to turn it into another word, eg, un-, dis-, mis-, re-, in-, il-, im-, ir-. Spelling learning: the /ai/ sound spelled 'ei', 'eigh' or 'ev.:the un-, dis and mis- prefixes :adding suffixes spelling split digraphs words from the Year 3/4 word list calendar caught centre century certain circle complete consider continue.
