First Sunday of Lent The Devil's Attention



If we imagine that temptation never seems to come our way, could it be that we're not worth the devil's attention? We tend to think of temptation as something that will lead us into a life of crime or immorality, but temptation is simply anything that threatens to take us away from God. If temptation never seems to come our way, perhaps it's because we are not trying to be close to

God in the first place. Many of us fail to recognise temptation, and the reason we fail is because we don't really know who we are or what we're about. It's surprising that we can get so far on in years without being about to answer simple questions like "What are you doing for God?" "How would you like to be remembered?" The reason we struggle with questions like these is because as human beings we are governed hugely by self interest. Self interest is essential for survival and it's in all of us, but as Christians we have to put self interest on a back burner and put in the time and effort into defining who we really would like to be. Once we have achieved this, then the devil's temptations are suddenly crystal clear. After all, we can't be tempted away from our path in life if we've no idea what our path in life is. If we have no plan, we are hardly worth the devil's attention.

When we choose to give up something this Lent, perhaps it should be something that reflects the path we have chosen and the temptation we are trying to transcend. If we decide to give up red wine for instance, with the intention of dropping a couple of dress sizes, God won't be hugely impressed and the devil won't be remotely interested. If we give up wine because we have identified that it is stopping us from doing some important work of God's making, our Lenten journey will take on a life changing significance. Jesus gives us an important clue; "Away with you, Satan! for it is written, 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him." When we make our daily choices ask, "Is this about me.... or is it about God?"

"Insanity is defined as doing the same thing over, and over again, yet expecting different results." This definition can be a good beginning reflection as we examine the choices we will make in the days ahead. This is the time of year to ask some uncomfortable questions. How often do we fail to hear the cry of the poor? How often do we fail to forgive and how often do we fail to see our own failings? Today we pray for all those who genuinely desire a change of heart.

MASS STIPENDS

Every week we receive numerous requests and offerings for Masses. This is very positive, since it shows that many parishioners are carrying loved ones, both living and departed, in prayer and want their intentions carried before God in the Church's most sublime prayer, the sacrifice of the Mass.

But the numbers mean that we get more requests than we have Masses. So it is necessary to send a certain number of Masses away to be said elsewhere, by priests who receive fewer intentions or none at all. This helps the priests concerned, and means that these Masses can be said more quickly than if they had to "wait their turn" in our parish. This happens mostly when numerous masses are requested for the same person, so that there will be at least some masses for that intention said publicly in the parish, and parishioners can attend and join their own prayer to the offering.

Every effort is made to comply with requests for a particular date or time when that is requested. However, there is still a significant backlog and so we need to ask those who are looking out for their intentions on the newsletter to be patient and bear in mind the needs of others. Remember also that God lives outside time. He can hear today the prayers that will be offered in the future just as he can those from the past. Nobody will lose out because a particular Mass offering takes time to be fulfilled. God sees what is in the heart of the person who asks for a Mass, and will respond to the generosity and patience of those who wait.
