#### World Communications Day Speaking With the Heart "The Truth in Love" (Eph 4: 15) Touching even the most hardened hearts

"In a world that 'so inclined towards indifference and indignation' at times even on the basis of disinformation which falsifies and exploits the truth, itis particularly important there is space for proclaiming the truth, even if at times it is uncomfortable."

Pope Francis calls for words capable of doing good for others and of touching even the "most hardened of hearts." He exhorts communicators, even in our dramatic global climate, to convey the "gentle strength of love."

While the message is primarily geared toward those working in communications, Pope Francis highlight that everyone has the responsibility to communicate "with an open heart and arms."

#### **Gospel Reflection - What is on Your Mind Today?**

What is on your mind today? Perhaps you have to get the car through its MOT. Perhaps you have to do the shopping with not enough money in your purse. Perhaps you have to get some work done with not enough hours in your day. Perhaps you have to visit a family member who is ill, or help your child fix a failed friendship at school. There is so much to do. Continuing Jesus' mission on earth problem doesn't figure much in the pages of our diaries.

Today we are privy to Jesus' prayer made on our behalf at the close of his ministry on earth. In this prayer, we are reminded that Jesus had finished the work that he had come to do. Jesus had made God's name known, so that all could share in eternal life. However, for this to happen, we have to carry the baton and keep Jesus' teaching alive in a world bursting with conflicting values.

The first disciples continued Jesus' mission without planes, trains, without a postal service, without TV or radio and without the internet. Yet thanks to these early disciples we are all very familiar with the promise of eternal life, even though these words were spoken over two thousand years ago. It doesn't matter how busy we are, life is so much easier for us than it was for those early disciples. We really don't have much excuse. We have been entrusted with an important job, yet for most of us, it is something we don't think about nearly enough. We are told not to let the world tie us down, but that's most definitely easier said than done. In truth we are very much of this world.

On this Sunday we celebrate World Communication Day, and it feels a timely opportunity to consider the task we have been set. We have all the benefits of a twenty first century world at our fingertips, now we just need to capture some of the passion that drove those early disciples.

We all know at least one person who sets a shining example. Perhaps it's here that we will find our motivation. Perhaps the people we most admire provide us with a model of who we ourselves would like to be. With a good example to emulate and our twenty first century means to spread God's love, change is not beyond any of us.

**Canon Christopher reflects** .... On the 40<sup>th</sup> day of Easter last Thursday, we celebrated the Solemnity of the Ascension. Some of the Holy Days of Obligation are transferred to a Sunday nearby but not in this case. I felt sad that many people did not acknowledge this important day when Jesus, having completed his life on earth, returned to heaven where he is at the right hand of the Father. As I said at Mass on Thursday Jesus could have asked the disciples: "Do you want the good news or the bad news?" The bad news was that he was leaving them which would no doubt make them feel sad and anxious since they felt so reliant on his presence with them. He went on to tell them the good news that he was going away to send the Holy Spirit who would help them to remember everything he had taught them. The Spirit came upon them at Pentecost (fifty days after Easter) and this we celebrate next weekend at what is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. During the next few days before then it is traditional to make a novena (a nine-day prayer) in preparation for that event, praying that the Spirit will guide us also in our endeavours to follow Jesus.

His final message to the disciples before his Ascension told them that they should go out to the whole world, proclaiming the Good News (the Gospel) and baptising in the name of the Trinity. This is why we call this Sunday 'Communications Day'. How could the disciples fulfil this commission with their limited access to the whole world, or even to the many people in their immediate vicinity? It is much more possible nowadays when our means of communication are so different and far-reaching. It is called mass-media. The apostles and disciples of today are encouraged to use every means at their disposal to broadcast the message which gets greater every passing year. We no longer seem to rely as much on the traditional ways of passing on the news but the digital age has totally transformed it and taken over our lives. We know there can be much unreliable news and we have to be careful what we read and accept. Jesus said "the truth will make us free" but we do not always read or hear the truth.

It is even more important then that the Church in the modern world must make use of these means of communication and in them speak with the voice of authority and truth. This is largely done through the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales. Each week we receive an email from there keeping us informed of news and events relating to the Church. Bishop John Arnold of the Diocese of Salford is the lead bishop for communications and he reminds us this week of the motto of the historic visit of Pope Benedict to this country when he beatified John Henry Newman in 2010 ... 'Heart speaks unto heart'. Bishop John tells how fitting it is that Pope makes this the central theme of his message for this year's 57th World Communications Day which we are celebrating. It is from the Bishops' Conference that we receive the various mementoes with prayers for important events e.g. the death of an important person. The special collection this weekend is in support of all this crucial work from the Conference of Bishops.
