### **NUT FREE ZONE!**


A reminder to all parents that children should not bring nuts, or foods containing nuts into school as there are children in our school who have a nut allergy.

## HELPFUL HINTS AND TIPS... ...FOR COMPLETING REMOTE LEARNING ON A PDF DOCUMENT

Rather than printing off a PDF, we have found some different ways of editing them and returning them to teachers:

- On an ipad, take a screen shot of the work, then annotate it using the photo editing tool, save it, and return it as an image to the teachers
- On a laptop / PC, take a print screen image (Press ctrl and PrtScn) then paste the image into Word (or equivalent) and use text boxes to complete the work on top of the image
- On a laptop / PC, open the PDF using Microsoft Edge, then use the drawing / highlighting tools in the tool bar at the top to complete. Once you have finished, click the "print" icon, but then change the printer to "save as PDF" and this will save you child's completed work as a new PDF that they can submit.

If you have found a solution to a problem worth sharing, then let us know and we will add it to our newsletter as I am sure others are coming across similar issues and would be grateful of solutions!



#### REMINDER ABOUT RETURNING WORK

Please make sure that you return completed work to your teacher as soon as it is done so that they can see how hard you are working, give you feedback and make sure that the next task set is appropriate. Please do not worry if it is not perfect - we are not expecting it to be - as in school, we learn from our mistakes so by letting your teacher see any issues or errors, they can plan to help you to sort it out.

You can return your work in a number of ways:

- Attach completed work on the assignment page shared by your teacher, and click "hand in" (preferred if possible!)
- Attach work to a private message to your teacher
- 3. Complete on paper, take a photograph and attach this as outlined in 1 or 2
- 4. Email to your teacher
